APPLICATION DEADLINE: MARCH 1, 2010

- FirstBank of Colorado Low Income Scholarship (\$500)***
 - Applicants must have a principle residence within the FirstBank service area of Colorado Springs to Ft. Collins; Aurora to Evergreen: or Vail, Avon, Breckenridge, Silverthorne and Greeley.
 - Preference given to low to moderate income applicants (based on information contained in the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipient must enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Grand Junction Rotary Scholarship (\$1,000)***
 - This award is available to all students. Rotary is a worldwide institution; awards are **not** limited to Mesa County residents or U.S. citizens.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 3.0 to be considered.
 - Awards are not limited to full-time enrollment status. Recipient may attend part-time.
 - Financial need will be a factor for determining selection of recipients. Financial need is based on information contained in the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - Special Circumstances – Special consideration will be made to students with special circumstances (i.e.: death in family, divorce, disadvantaged, or facing adversity).
 - A recipient of this award shall be a guest at the Rotary Club's Wednesday luncheon meeting sometime during the academic year.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Ron Halsey Memorial Scholarship for Disabled Students (\$600)***
 - Mesa State College full-time disabled student.
 - Must have a physical disability with preference to students with an accident-related paralysis, multiple sclerosis or severe vision or hearing impairment.
 - Can be U. S. or international student.
 - Minimum 3.0 GPA.
 - One year Scholarship.

- Chris and Connie Jouflas Family Scholarship (\$1500)***
 - Mesa State College Student of Eastern Orthodox Christian religion.
 - Full-time or part-time.
 - Minimum 2.5 GPA
 - One-year scholarship.

- Junior Service League Scholarship (\$500)***
 - Mesa State College Sophomore, Junior or Senior, female student seeking a baccalaureate degree.
 - Must be over 18.
 - Must be a Mesa County resident
 - Must have documented financial need.
 - Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
 - Must be full-time (12+ hours per semester)

- Rachel Khumalo Book Scholarship (\$1000)***
 - Mesa State College Sophomore, Junior or Senior.
 - Must have documented financial need.
 - Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA.
 - Must be full-time (12+ hours per semester)

- Lathrop Scholarship Fund (In-state tuition and fees, maximum of 12 credit hours per semester)***
 - Mesa State College student whose family make their living in farming or ranching.
 - Preference will be given to students actively involved in agricultural activities and to those enrolled in course work supporting an agricultural career choice.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 3.0 to be considered.
 - Must be a graduate of a Western Slope, Colorado high school.
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipient must enroll full time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Mesa State College Emeriti and Retirees Scholarship (\$750)***
 - Mesa State College Associate degree student or a Junior or Senior in a Baccalaureate degree program.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be considered.
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipient must enroll full time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Nagatomo, George and Masuo Memorial Scholarship (\$2000)***
 - Available to a Mesa State College student, U.S. citizen of Asian descent (Amerasian) with preference given to those with a Japanese heritage. Exceptions will include relatives or kin of the Nagatomo family.
 - International students can be considered if no U.S. citizen applies.
 - Any area of study except Theatre.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 3.0 to be considered.
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipient must enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Student Leadership and Service Recognition Award (\$1000)***
 - Applicants must document having Mesa State College campus or living experience, or contracted campus dining experience, or have worked for Sodexho-Marriott dining services.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be considered.
 - Must have earned at least 24 hours of credit and two semesters earned at Mesa State College.
 - Applicants will be considered on a basis of demonstrated leadership experience, community service, involvement in student activities, and experience in the hospitality industry.
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipients must enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.

- Zoppel, Mark Scholarship (\$1,000)***
 - Mesa State College International student.
 - Must have a minimum institutional cumulative GPA of 3.0 to be considered.
 - Full-time enrollment – Recipient must enroll full time (minimum of 12 credit hours each semester) and complete at least 12 hours each semester to receive this scholarship.
 - One-year scholarship.
