RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Employ available instructional technology, i.e. the internet, learning management systems, smart rooms, and interactive technology, when appropriate.
- Evaluate student performance fairly and consistently and provide timely feedback.
- Assist in assessing program outcomes.
- Assist in representing and marketing the program to the private and public sector.
