

**STUDENT LIABILITY**—Once you register for courses, you are academically and financially responsible for your courses, whether or not you attend courses. You can drop all of your courses prior to the first day of courses without penalty. Once courses start, there are published deadlines to add, drop, or withdraw from class with varying refund rates and grade options.

**PAYMENT**—Tuition and fees are due by the end of the business day on the first day of class unless you enroll in the Deferred Payment Plan through MAVzone. **Financial Aid**

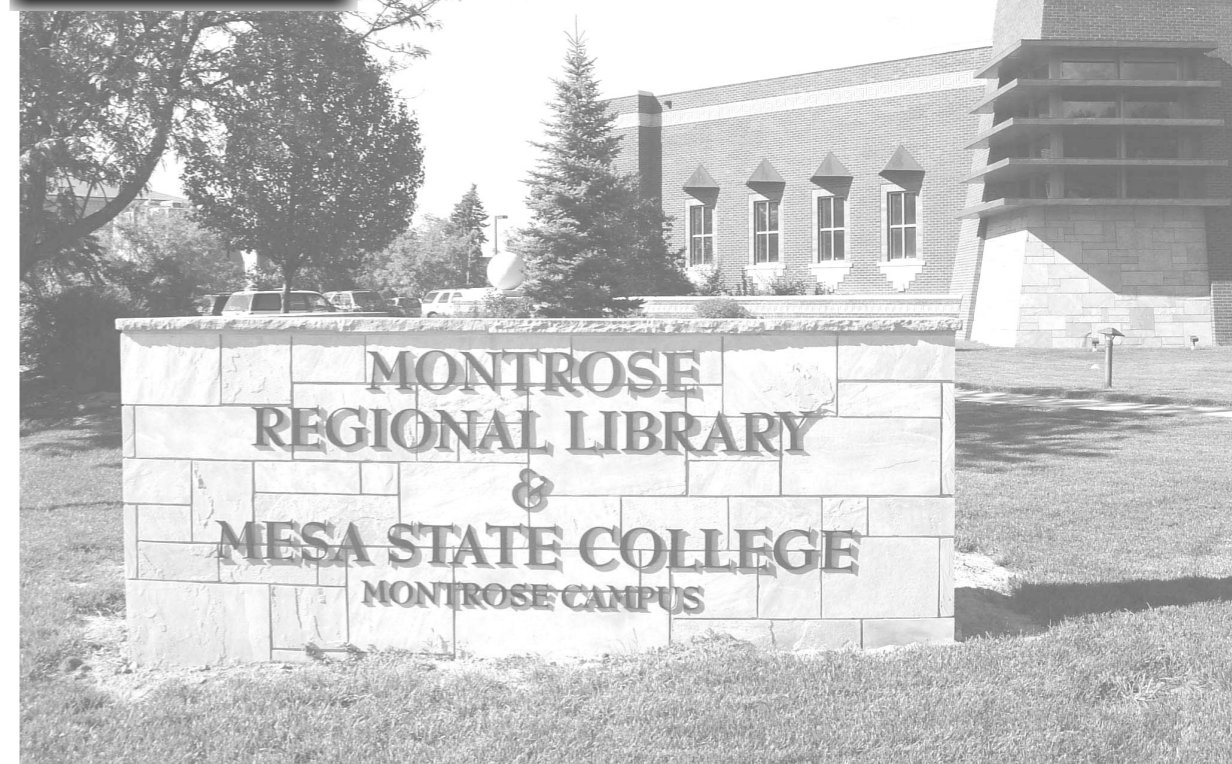
