Spring 2010 Total Withdrawal Deadlines The following refund rates apply if a student is totally withdrawing from ALL COURSES. To totally withdraw once the semester begins, the student must fill out and complete a Total Withdraw Form.

Dates for Classes starting January 19	Tuition and Fees Refund Policy
Before 11:59 p.m. on January 18	100% Refund of Tuition and Fees
January 19—February 2	\$175 Partial Tuition Assessment (Newly matriculated student will be assessed the \$125 matriculation fee plus a \$50 Partial Tuition Assessment)
After 5:00 p.m. on February 2	No Refund—Full payment of tuition and fees required

J-Term classes must be dropped by January 3rd to qualify for a 100% refund. If a student is enrolled in J-Term classes and drops all their classes on January 4, the student will owe the \$175 Partial Tuition Assessment. After the first day of class, full payment of tuition and fees is required for the J-Term classes.
