Music Camp includes five days of excellent instruction from the Music Faculty at Mesa State College. Also included in the price is a Music Camp T-Shirt; one private lesson with Mesa State faculty and Music enrichment courses. Students perform in the Music Camp Band, Choir, Orchestra, or Jazz Band. During the day students are supervised by faculty and staff. During recreational time and the evenings students are supervised by our excellent counseling staff that consists of our Music Education majors as well as residence hall staff (after 9:30 p.m.)

Directions to Camp: Mesa State College Music Camp is held in the Moss Performing Arts Center on the southeast part of campus. (on 12th street near the corner of 12th and North) <http://www.mesastate.edu/main/maps/maincampusmap.htm>

Check -In: 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 6 in the Walter Walker foyer of the Moss Performing Arts Center outside Robinson Theater. Auditions begin at 2:15 p.m. Quietly wait outside your audition room until there is an opening. You may put your cases in Robinson Theater and warm up. If you made full payment in advance, pre-registered for music enrichment courses and have all required forms filled out, you do not need to arrive until 2:30 p.m.

Required Forms: Liability Waiver, Medical Form, CD/Picture/DVD Slide Show order form (if you wish to purchase) Lunch registration and payment for parents and guests for Friday's pre-concert lunch (\$7.50 per person) if you plan to join us for lunch.

Audition Material: Instrumentalists bring an etude, exercise from your method book or part of a solo for auditions. Be prepared to play major scales up to 2 sharps/flats for your instrument and chromatic scale (one octave). Vocalists should bring a solo or sing a passage from a piece you performed this year in choir. Students who play bass guitar, guitar, piano or drumset and wish to perform in the jazz band, prepare a short excerpt from a jazz piece.

Residence Hall Check In: If you are staying in the Residence Hall, check-in is from 12:00 – 3:00 p.m. in the lobby of Grand Mesa Hall. A keycard will be issued to you, which is also used for meals at the Maverick Pavilion. The phone number for the front desk at Grand Mesa Hall is: (970) 986-3004. **NOTE: FEE for lost card is \$15.00.**

Meals: For those students who are staying in the Residence Hall and for those who have chosen the Commuter 1 or 2 package, meals are in the Maverick Pavilion. Students dining on campus but staying at home will be issued a meal card. Students bringing a sack lunch may eat on the picnic tables in the quad outside the Moss Performing Arts Center.
NOTE: The fee for a lost card is \$15.00!!

Registration deadline: May 28th, 2010 to insure acceptance into the camp. After May 28th, musicians will be taken on an “as needed basis” to fill sections in the large ensembles.

Check Out: All students are required to stay until the conclusion of the Final Concert on Friday. Dorm check out is by 7:15 a.m. Friday morning. Luggage is taken to the Recital Hall. ALL RESIDENTS are expected to clean their rooms and leave them in the condition in which they were found. Cleaning tools are available. This MUST be done before you go to breakfast. It is best to pack and clean on Thursday night before lights out.

PARENTS – Lunch on Friday with students: Parents and guests are welcome to join us for lunch on Friday. We must be informed at check-in how many people are joining us for lunch on Friday. Payment for lunch will be made at check in.

DAY CAMPERS (Commuters): Plan to be picked up in front of the Moss Performing Arts Center off of 12th Street. Parents approach from the north and pull into the drop-off zone, and pull as far forward as possible. Students, please do not cross 12th street! Drivers are not as attentive to the crosswalks in the summer as they should be.

CELL PHONES: Students are allowed to have cell phones during Music Camp, but they will need to be turned off during rehearsals or classes. No texting during class or rehearsals!
