

DSST Application Brochure

DSST examinations allow students to earn credits for knowledge they already have.

Payments:

In order to register for a DSST testing date, you must pay a \$25 CMU scheduling charge. An additional \$100 per examination is paid directly to DSST the day of the test. The DSST examination charge can only be paid with a credit/debit card.

Scheduling changes and Refund Policy:

All CMU payments are pre-paid and non-refundable and must be paid at least 24 hours prior to your chosen testing date. There is a \$20 rescheduling charge for all cancellations or for missing your appointment. Please verify that the institution you are testing for will accept the DSST exam you're scheduled to take. No refund will be given to examinees who register for incorrect tests.

Testing Requirements:

Government Issuded Photo ID required at check-in. Examinees without a photo ID will be subject to the reschedule charge.

Students with Disabilities:

Students needing special testing accommodations should contact 1-800-967-1139. Prior approval is required before scheduling a testing appointment.

Score Reports and Policies:

Information for Colorado Mesa University Students: A student may not earn DSST credit in a class in which they have previously been enrolled including a class from which the student withdrew, so that the transcript shows a W, WP, or WF. The faculty and department heads of each department determine if and under what conditions non-traditional credit is allowed. These non-traditional credits included CLEP, DSST, Credit by Examination/Challenge Exams. If allowed, the following limits apply (includes credits from each type of non-traditional credit); Maximum of 30 semester credit hours for baccalaureate degree, 20 semester credit hours for Associate of Applied Science degree, 12 semester credit hours for an Associate of Arts or Associates of Science degree, and 6 semester credit hours for a technical certificate.
