



# YOUR STEPS TO ENROLL @ WESTERN COLORADO COMMUNITY COLLEGE

<p><b>Step 1: Application</b> WCCC Student Services 970-255-2670 <a href="http://www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc">www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc</a></p>	<p><b>Apply.</b> Complete the admissions application online at <a href="http://www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc">www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc</a>. Click “Apply Online” at bottom of page.</p> <p><b>Request Final Transcripts or GED scores.</b> Send official high school or GED scores and official transcripts from each college attended. Official transcripts must be sent to WCCC for financial aid and graduation eligibility.</p>
<p><b>Step 2: Financial Aid and Scholarships</b> Financial Aid Office or Student Services 970-248-1396 or 970-255-2670 <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/">http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/</a></p>	<p><b>Complete your FASFA.</b> If you plan to apply for scholarships or financial aid, you may complete the online application form for fall semester beginning in January. The priority deadline for financial aid is March 1.</p>
<p><b>Step 3: College Opportunity Fund</b> Student Services 970-255-2670 <a href="http://www.coloradomesa.edu/cof/index.html">http://www.coloradomesa.edu/cof/index.html</a></p>	<p><b>Apply for the College Opportunity Grant.</b> The College Opportunity Fund (COF) was created by the Colorado Legislature to provide a stipend to eligible Colorado undergraduate students. The stipend pays a portion of your total in-state tuition when you attend a Colorado public institution or a participating private institution. Eligible undergraduate students must apply, be admitted, and enroll at a participating institution. Qualifying Colorado residents may use the stipend for eligible undergraduate classes. The stipend is paid on a per credit hour basis to the institution at which the student is enrolled.</p>

Apply online through MAVzone student portal.</p>

Out-of-state freshman or Transfer Students are strongly encouraged to attend one of the many orientation programs we have planned. Payment may be made in person at CMU, by mail, online through MAVzone, or by phone at 248-1567. Cash, checks, and credit cards are accepted. All past due accounts must be paid in full prior to September 15<sup>th</sup> for the Fall semester and February 15<sup>th</sup> for the Spring semester to avoid additional late fees.
