<p>Step 1: Admission WCCC Student Services 970-255-2670 www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc</p>	<p>Apply. Complete the admissions application in person at Student Services, located at 2508 Blichmann Avenue, or apply online at www.coloradomesa.edu/wccc. Request Final Transcripts. Send official high school or GED scores and official transcripts from each college attended. Official transcripts must be sent to WCCC for financial aid and graduation eligibility.</p>
<p>Step 2: Financial Aid and Scholarships Financial Aid Office or Student Services 970-248-1396 or 970-255-2670 http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/</p>	<p>Complete your FASFA. If you plan to apply for scholarships or financial aid, you may pick up application forms for fall beginning in January. The priority deadline for financial aid is March 1.</p>
<p>Step 3: College Opportunity Fund Student Services 970-255-2670 http://www.coloradomesa.edu/cof/index.html</p>	<p>Apply for the College Opportunity Grant. The College Opportunity Fund (COF) was created by the Colorado Legislature to provide a stipend to eligible undergraduate students. The stipend pays a portion of your total in-state tuition when you attend a Colorado public institution or a participating private institution. Eligible undergraduate students must apply, be admitted, and enroll at a participating institution. Qualifying students may use the stipend for eligible undergraduate classes. The stipend is paid on a per credit hour basis to the institution at which the student is enrolled.</p>
<p>Step 4: Housing 970-248-1536 http://www.coloradomesa.edu/housing/housingapply.html</p>	<p>Housing is available. Submit the housing application and \$150 deposit (includes \$25 non-refundable application fee). The CMU Residence Halls fill quickly, so apply early.</p>

All new incoming, in-state, freshmen are required to attend a Student Orientation program at CMU. As an out-of-state freshman or Transfer Student, we strongly encourage you to attend one of the many orientation programs we have planned. <p>Step 6: Billing Information and Deadlines Student Services 970-255-2670</p>	<p>Tuition and fees, including housing and meals, are due and payable on the first day of class. Payment may be made in person in the Business Office located in Lowell Heiny Hall, by mail, or by phone at 248-1567. Cash, checks, and credit cards are accepted. All past due accounts must be paid in full prior to September 15th for the Fall semester and February 15th for the Spring semester to avoid additional late fees. Payment plans available.</p>
