About This Major . . .

The Bachelor of Arts degree in Mass Communications provides students with four concentration areas: Broadcasting; News/Editorial; Public Relations/Advertising; and Print Media. The overriding goal in the program is to offer students an opportunity to develop the knowledge, theory and skills that will assist them in securing employment in the broad field of mass communications.

Mesa State's Mass Communication majors are employed across the country at radio and TV stations, newspapers, advertising and public relations firms, and various business enterprises such as hospitals, banks, insurance companies, and schools. More specifically, a Mesa State Mass Communications graduate is now the marketing and PR director for the Grand Junction Downtown Authority. Others work in public relations for the National Football League, as the Marketing and Communications Director for the Metro North Chamber of Commerce, and as editor and designer for Summit Catalog Company

POLICIES:

- 1. It is your responsibility to determine whether you have met the requirements for your degree. Please see your MSC Catalog for a complete list of graduation requirements.
- 2. You must go to the Registrar's Office and fill out the "Intent to Graduate" form at the beginning of the semester prior to graduating.
- 3. This program sheet must be submitted with your graduation planning sheet to your advisor during the semester prior to graduating, no later than September 15 for Spring graduates, February 15 for Fall graduates.
- 4. Your advisor will sign and forward the Program Sheet, Intent to Graduate Form, and Graduation Planning Sheet to the Department Head for signature.
- 5. Finally, the Department Head or the department administrative assistant will take the signed forms to the Registrar's Office. (Students cannot handle the forms once the advisor signs.)
- 6. If your petition for graduation is denied, it will be your responsibility to reapply for graduation in a subsequent semester. Your "Intent to Graduate" does not automatically move to a later graduation date.
- 7. NOTE: The semester before graduation, you will be required to take a Major Field Achievement Test (Exit Exam).

Bachelor of Arts: Mass Communications

- Must earn 120 semester hours and meet the academic residency requirements to earn a baccalaureate degree at Mesa State College.
- Must earn a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper division courses (i.e., 300-level and 400-level courses).
- A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher must be maintained for all courses taken and a 2.5 GPA or higher for all courses in the major.
- When filling out this program sheet a course can only be used once, i.e., no double counting is allowed between categories.
- Excess HPWE courses beyond the two required and pre-collegiate courses (usually numbered below 100) cannot be used for graduation.
- All degree requirements must be completed as described. Any exceptions or substitutions must be recommended in advance by the faculty advisor and approved by the Department Head.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

Continuance in the Mass Communications program after the sophomore year will be contingent upon the student satisfying the following requirements:

- (a) Completion of the English Composition sequence, with at least a 3.0 GPA (no grade below B).
- (b) Completion of the two introductory courses (MASS 110 and MASS 201) in Mass Communications with at least a 2.5 GPA and no grade of "D" or "F".
- (c) Maintenance of at least a 2.5 GPA in Mass Communications courses, in addition to at least a 2.0 GPA overall, is necessary for Mass Communications majors to proceed to graduation.

General Electives: 30 Semester Hours; 4-7 semester hours of upper division credit may be needed.

Students are required to participate in exit examinations or other programs deemed necessary to comply with the college accountability requirement. All degree requirements must be completed as described above. Any exceptions or substitutions must be recommended in advance by the faculty advisor and approved by the Department Head.
