About This Major . . .

The Associate of Science (A.S.) degree is designed for students who intend to continue their education and obtain a baccalaureate degree. Following the education ladder concept, the A.S. is an appropriate choice for community college students who will eventually take upper division coursework in sport management, business, athletic training, and kinesiology. The degree program includes the Colorado Statewide General Education Core and meets the lower-division general education requirements at most public institutions in Colorado. The program is designed for students who intend to continue on, but want to show completion of a two-year degree.

The Sport Management A.S. degree, in addition to providing students with their general education requirements, is useful in giving students an overview of the discipline of Sport Management and how it applies to the business of sport in all of its many facets. Western Colorado's active lifestyle provides the student a variety of opportunities for internships and entry-level employment in commercial or public recreation and sport organizations. Graduates of this program may obtain entry-level positions in sport management or continue to purse their bachelor-level education to obtain eventual higher level positions in sport management, business, or kinesiology related positions

POLICIES:

- 1. It is your responsibility to determine whether you have met the requirements for your degree. Please see the MSC Catalog for a complete list of graduation requirements.
- 2. You must turn in your "Intent to Graduate" form to the Registrar's Office by September 15 if you plan to graduate the following May, and by February 15 if you plan to graduate the following December.
- 3. This program sheet must be submitted with your graduation planning sheet to your advisor during the semester prior to the semester of graduation, no later than October 1 for spring graduates, no later than March 1 for fall graduates.
- 4. Your advisor will sign and forward the Program Sheet and Graduation Planning Sheet to the Department Head for signature.
- 5. Finally, the Department Head or the department administrative assistant will take the signed forms to the Registrar's Office. (Students cannot handle the forms once the advisor signs.)
- 6. If your petition for graduation is denied, it will be your responsibility to reapply for graduation in a subsequent semester. Your "Intent to Graduate" does not automatically move to a later graduation date.
- 7. NOTE: The semester before graduation, you may be required to take a Major Field Achievement Test (exit exam).
