Spanish majors at Mesa choose from one of three tracks: *Applied Professional*, *Secondary Teaching Licensure*, and *Language and Literature*. Classes provide knowledge and skills related to effective communication in Spanish as well as an understanding of the relationship of the Spanish language and its cultures to the world in which we live. Applied Professional majors attend classes that strengthen their skills in the professional environment. Secondary Licensure majors study all aspects of the language and cultures of the Spanish-speaking world and its teaching.

Spanish Language and Literature majors gain valuable insights into Peninsular and Latin-American language and literature as well as their histories and cultures. Students are provided with an intensive examination of literature as seen through the various genres (poetry, narrative, theatre and film). Students are given knowledge of both the sounds of the Hispanic world and the general linguistic properties of the Spanish language. Graduates work in the secondary schools or may continue their studies in graduate school.

Students are introduced to the general linguistic properties of the Spanish language as well as being presented with a focused study of Spanish phonetics and phonology.

### POLICIES:

1. It is your responsibility to determine whether you have met the requirements for your degree. Please see the MSC Catalog for a complete list of graduation requirements.
2. You must turn in your "Intent to Graduate" form to the Registrar's Office **by September 15 if you plan to graduate the following May, and by February 15 if you plan to graduate the following December.**
3. This program sheet must be submitted with your graduation planning sheet to your advisor during the **semester prior to the semester of graduation, no later than October 1 for spring graduates, no later than March 1 for fall graduates.**
4. Your advisor will sign and forward the Program Sheet and Graduation Planning Sheet to the Department Head for signature.
5. Finally, the Department Head or the department administrative assistant will take the signed forms to the Registrar's Office. (Students cannot handle the forms once the advisor signs.)
6. If your petition for graduation is denied, it will be your responsibility to reapply for graduation in a subsequent semester. Your "Intent to Graduate" does not automatically move to a later graduation date.

**Degree Requirements:**

- 120 semester hours total (A minimum of 28 taken at MSC)
- 40 upper division credits (A minimum of 15 taken within the major at MSC)
