- If your petition for graduation is denied, it will be your responsibility to reapply for graduation in a subsequent semester. Your "Intent to Graduate" does not automatically move to a later graduation date.
- NOTE: The semester before graduation, you will be required to take a Major Field Achievement Test (Exit Exam).
