<u>Day 26</u>: Did you know that, in addition to maintaining accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission since 1957, 13 of the institution's programs meet standards set by a national agency to receive specialized accreditation?

 early as Fall 2019.
- Mechanical Engineering Technology accredited by the Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission of ABET.
- Medical Laboratory Technician accredited by the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences.
- Music accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music.
- Nursing:
 - Master's and Doctoral levels accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.
 - o <u>Baccalaureate level</u> accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education and approved by the Colorado State Board of Nursing for licensure.
 - Associate level accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. and approved by the Colorado State Board of Nursing for licensure.
 - <u>Practical nurse level</u> accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. and approved by the Colorado State Board of Nursing for licensure.
- Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) approved by the Colorado Peace Officer Standards and Training Board.
- Radiologic Sciences accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology.
- Social Work accredited by the Commission on Accreditation-Council on Social Work Education.
- Teacher Education approved by the Colorado Department of Higher Education and the Colorado Department of Education to prepare teachers for initial licensure.
- Transportation Services approved by the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation.

Colorado Mesa University also is approved as a member institution as part of the National Council-State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (<u>NC-SARA</u>) which establishes comparable national standards for interstate offering of postsecondary distance education.
