

Day 4: Did you know the final reporting of CMU's comprehensive evaluation focuses on its two branch campuses?

The final submission of CMU's comprehensive evaluation process is the completion of two multi-campus reports, one each for the WCCC Bishop Campus and the CMU Montrose Campus. Each report opens with an overview that explains the governance and oversight of the institution's operations, including the processes for assuring and improving educational quality, resource allocation, evaluation and planning, staffing, services, and budget and revenues. The overview also describes the patterns of administrative structures, resources, instructional delivery methods, and means of student access to services and resources at different campuses.

In addition to the overview, the institution includes a single data page for each branch campus that includes the following:

- a. date of inception,
- b. programs offered,
- c. actual enrollments for each program,
- d. projected enrollments for the next three years,
- e. number of full-time and part-time faculty who teach at the facility,
- f. number of administrators on-site,
- g. student service available at the campus,
- h. additional locations linked to the campus, and
- i. campus-specific information for any campus that might function differently than the University's standard branch campus practices.
