Admission Criteria

To be admitted into the Graphic Design Program at Colorado Mesa University, students must meet several prerequisites. Prior to admission, prospective Graphic Design Majors will be given the classification code for “pre-Graphic Design.” To be eligible for admission, a student must have successfully completed the following:

1. Two-Dimensional Design (ARTE 101)
2. Three-Dimensional Design (ARTE 102)
3. Foundation Drawing (ARTS 151)
4. Graphic Design I (ARTG 215)
5. Graphic Design II (ARTG 221)
6. B or A better in the major
7. Graphic Design Entrance Exam 80% min.
8. Portfolio Review (See Graphic Design Portfolio Criteria)

An application for admission should be submitted to your Graphic Design Advisor when you have met the above requirements. A grade of “C” in any one of the courses specifically identified above is not acceptable, regardless of overall GPA. The Graphic Design faculty may make exceptions to any of the above requirements in extraordinary circumstances.
