



Live Proctoring Using Zoom with Respondus LDB

When LockDown Browser (LDB) is used with "Instructor Live Proctoring," the instructor watches students remotely during an online test. This feature requires the use of a video conference system such as Zoom and is intended for small classes where the instructor can view all students on the screen at once.

The instructor and students meet in the video conferencing application at a specified time. When ready, the instructor provides students a start code for the online exam – students start LDB from there. The instructor can then watch students via the video conference system for the duration of the exam.



Setting up your Live Proctoring Session

Create your Zoom Meeting


It is important that you create a unique meeting for this Proctored Quiz Session. To do so follow these instructions:

1. Go to your Zoom Web client, select "Settings on the left hand side






2. Go to "In Meeting (Basic)"




3. Turn off private chat.






4. Click on "Schedule a Meeting"




5. Schedule your meeting at the agreed upon time, for the correct duration. Leave some time to give instructions and some extra for after the exam to follow up. 15 minutes extra time is recommended. You can also choose to automatically record the session if you think it necessary.






6. Once saved, go your meetings and copy the meeting link. Leave this browser page open for reference in the next two steps.



Setting up Your Quiz for Live Proctoring


The following steps are best practice for setting up your D2L quizzes for live proctoring.

1. In the quiz tool choose "Edit" from the drop down of your quiz






2. Expand the description. Paste the ZOOM meeting link into the description using the "Insert Stuff" button






3. Paste the Zoom link into the dialog box



4. Edit the "j" and change it to "wc/join"




5. Give your URL a meaningful description (quiz name) and click "Insert"






6. Add any additional instructions and save.




7. Go to restrictions






8. Add a password of your choice. You will give students this password when they have joined the ZOOM proctoring session.




9. Click "Save and Close"




Enable Lockdown Browser

1. From the quiz tool choose the LockDown Browser Dashboard:






2. In the LDB Dashboard click the dropdown next to your quiz and select "Settings":



3. Select "Require LockDown Brower for this exam"






4. Open the "Advanced Settings" menu"




5. Choose "Allow Specific External Web Domains:






6. Paste the ZOOM link into the open dialog box

Managing a Live Proctor Session

Student Communication

We recommend clearly discussing your live proctoring plans with your students. This should be done in your syllabus.

It is also recommended that you perform a practice quiz session with your class to alleviate any stress from the situation. Provide a link to the <u>CMU credentialed LDB download</u> in your syllabus.

Your live proctoring session must be a different ZOOM meeting than your synchronous class session. Your students will go to the quiz link in D2L. When they click the link, they will see the directions with the ZOOM link. This will open a ZOOM web client in their browser. Once inside the ZOOM session the students can be given the password orally or via chat. The student can then start the quiz/exam which will initiate the LDB. Once the LDB starts, the students will not see the zoom session as they will be locked out of their previous browser. You will still be able to see the students.
