- B. Curriculum should not be created based upon a specific faculty. Topics courses are a better mechanism for specialized courses. Curriculum should be based upon the coursework that best fits that program.
- C. If a course is significantly changed through the course description, course content and/or SLOs, that course will need to be deactivated and a new course proposed. The course number may not be "reused".
- D. Remind faculty to use templates when creating new programs. It will make the process much easier.
- E. Course changes and program modifications should be submitted to workflow at the same time.
- F. April meeting to include voting on revised curriculum manual, revised calendar and descriptions for reserved numbers which will be included in manual.
