The SLO components he will be looking for are: 1) action verb, 2) content in the form of a skill, 3) context, and conditions of that context, and 4) evidence and assessment.

UCC Discussion: Offer more technical and specific instruction on animation techniques used in Western animation studios. This is more in-depth with Toon Boom software and specialized techniques than what's covered in ARTA 225 Principles of Animation class. We are running this course as a topics this semester, so it makes sense to create a class rather than keep running topics in the future. The students were excited for this additional opportunity.

UCC Discussion: This class has not been offered in a while and did not get updated when CIM clean up was happening, or when the whole Art and Design department changed their course minutes. The class is now in demand again and needs to be updated with the following changes: 1) Added topical course outline, semesters offered, and SLOs as information was not transferred in when CIM was implemented. 2) Changed title from 3D Digital Modeling to 3D Digital Animation and removed two words from course description to accurately reflect the course content. 3) Changed Instructional Activity from Lecture/Lab: Vocational/Tech to Mixed Instructional Method. Following extensive discussions in the Art and Design Department on how to facilitate student learning more effectively, we have revised the class structure to better support flexible student learning by balancing lecture and studio time. These changes better reflect how we currently teach and will create better outcomes for our students. Contact hours, academic engagement, and student prep minutes were also updated to reflect the change to Mixed Instructional Method.

UCC Discussion: The increase in demand for immersive experiences (VR, AR), live concert and performance visuals, and gallery installations make this course important for artists who want to pursue non-traditional non-narrative techniques and careers in media, such as creating visuals for concerts, theater productions, non-traditional movie theater venues like art galleries, the Las Vegas Sphere, and interactive and immersive experiences like Meow Wolf. The course will also appeal to Studio Art, Graphic Design, and Theatre/Music majors.
