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UCC Discussion: Our program has grown significantly causing some classes to require two sections, which restricts the professors from offering more electives. Often an Animator will view an upper film class as something to check off degree works, and film students will view upper animation classes as the same. We've already turned one photo class into an elective to help alleviate this issue, now we will do the same with the film and animation classes. This allows students to choose a "track" (Film, Photo, or Animation) in their upper classes before creating a senior thesis. It is similar to what Studio Arts has in place, where students can specialize in one area.

ECON 201: Principles of Macroeconomics-GTSS1	3	Course Modification - Approved	Stern Bickham
<p>UCC Discussion: Removing the prerequisite would give students greater flexibility in planning their coursework and following the recommended sequence. This course is accessible to freshmen. I surveyed universities in Colorado in Spring 2024 and found that all allow freshmen to enroll. Most universities do not require a prerequisite for ECON 201 with the expectation of the occasional algebra/English course. Two common issues with the current prerequisite are: 1. Students who are a credit or two short of being classified as sophomores but are in their third semester at CMU often need overrides to enroll. Some students may assume they cannot take the course and delay enrollment, potentially affecting their graduation timeline. 2. Students often postpone taking ECON 201 and ECON 202 until their junior or senior years. This delay can prevent them from exploring economics earlier and applying foundational knowledge in their upper-division courses.</p>

ECON 202: Principles of Microeconomics-GTSS1	3	Course Modification - Approved	Stern Bickham
<p>UCC Discussion: The prerequisite is intended to enforce a specific sequence for economics courses. However, ECON 201 and ECON 202 cover distinct content areas and do not build on each other. Although there is some overlap in basic concepts like supply and demand for about 2 to 3 weeks, the courses diverge significantly. ECON 202 addresses topics such as efficiency, elasticities, price determination, and market failures, which do not depend on ECON 201's content on GDP, unemployment, investment, and the business cycle. According to my research, only one university in Colorado requires students to take these courses in sequence, which is the reverse of our current order. In most Principles of Economics textbooks, microeconomics is presented before macroeconomics. Eliminating the prerequisite would offer students more flexibility and help them complete their requirements on time. Here are two main issues with the current prerequisite: 1. Course Availability: Macro is typically offered in the fall, while micro is offered in the spring. Online sections for these courses fill up quickly, causing potential delays of up to a year for students to complete the sequence. We often grant overrides to allow students to take ECON 202 first to avoid such delays. 2. Grade Requirements: Students who earn a D in ECON 201 cannot enroll in ECON 202. While this issue affects a small number of students, it forces them to retake a course with material they may not need, delaying their progress. Currently, students must achieve a C in ECON 201 but can graduate with a D in ECON 202. Removing this prerequisite would align grade requirements between the two courses and</p>			

improve consistency. (The exception applies to students in economics or programs requiring upper-division economics courses.)
