The graduate nursing program is integrating the *new* Essentials that American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) into our program tracks. AACN's model and framework for nursing curriculum uses a *competency-based education* system of active learning strategies focused on mastery of knowledge, skills, and attitudes (KSA's). Competency guidelines are delineated for entry-level programs and advanced-level programs. AACN released the following document to assist with the collaboration of academia and practice. 
