Welcome to the home of the Mavericks! This is a list of suggested items on what to bring to school. We strongly recommend that you consult with your roommates about what you plan to bring. There is limited space and it is important to be considerate for each other.

Appliances

- Iron
- Stereo
- Alarm Clock
- Computer or Laptop/Printer**
- Surge Protector/Power strip
- Television
- Room telephone (No Caller-ID)
- Microwave (under 850 watts)
- Refrigerator (up to 5 cubic ft.)*
***Check with roommate, only one refrigerator per room.**
- TV (may NOT be mounted to wall)
- VCR or DVD Player
- Gaming system
- Timer for Laundry
- Small set of dishes, pots, utensils
****Computer labs and printer available in all of the residence halls**

Bed & Bath

- Bedspread/Comforter Blankets
- EXTRA LONG TWIN sheets (mattresses are 80 inches long) x 2
- Mattress Pad and Pillow(s)
- Case(s) Toilet Paper
 - o Orchard Ave, Walnut Ridge, North Avenue, Grand Mesa, Bunting, Monument.
- Personal Toiletries
- Hair Dryer, Curling Iron, Flat Iron
- Shower Shoes and Robe
- Towels/Washcloths
- Additional trash can(s)

Cleaning Items

- Bathroom cleaning supplies
 - o Orchard Ave., Walnut Ridge, North Ave, Grand Mesa, Bunting, Monument
 - Kitchen cleaning supplies
 - o Orchard Ave., Walnut Ridge, & North Avenue apartments only
 - Broom / Swiffer wet mop
- *Check out vacuums from the front desk of your residence hall**

Laundry Items ***

- Detergent [High Efficiency (HE) soap ONLY]
 - Dryer Sheets
 - Laundry Bag/Basket
 - Stain Remover
 - Clothes Drying Rack
 - Hangers
- ***Laundry is Free--no coins needed**

Miscellaneous Items

- Backpack

- Binders, Papers, Pen/pencils

- Sports Equipment
- 3 M Poster Tabs to hang things
 - o **NO** nails, screws, tacks, push pins, duct tape allowed for hanging things

- Stadium chair (for room or balcony)
- Bike (w/ good lock), long board

- Pets (Except harmless fish-/10 gal. tank or less)
