- BORN IN EL PASO TEXAS ON JULY 30 1960
- Luis studied art and architecture at the <u>University of</u> <u>Texas</u> in Austin
- HE WAS KNOWN FOR USING LARGE POLYCHROMED FIBERGLASS TO CREATE HIS SCULPTURES
- His art was usually depictions of Southwestern and Hispanic themes
- He died in his studio on June 13, 2006

- On June 13 2006, while Luis was working on the head, the sculpture fell and killed him.
- The head landed on his leg and severed an artery
