



## College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

CLEP examinations allow students to earn credits for knowledge they already have.

### Test dates:

CLEP is offered weekly at the CMU-Testing Center, by appointment only.

### Pre-Registration:

To pay CLEP the \$95 fee, you need to go to the [CLEP Website](#) and create an account. After you create an account, you will need to log in and select the exam you want to take and pay CLEP fee. Once you have paid the fee, CLEP will generate a registration ticket for you. You **MUST** bring the registration ticket with you on your testing date. If you do not have it, you may have to reschedule your appointment.

### Payments:

CMU charges a \$25 proctoring fee. If your institution requires an essay or oral exam, there is an additional \$25 charge per exam.

### Scheduling changes and Refund Policy:

All CMU payments are pre-paid and non-refundable. When available, the student's account will be billed the CMU proctoring fee. Credit card payment is also available through [Market Place](#). Please verify that the institution you are testing for will accept the CLEP exam you're scheduled to take. No refund will be given to examinees who register for incorrect tests, no show the appointments or reschedule the exam within 24 hours of the original appointment.

### Testing Requirements:

Government issued photo ID is required at check-in. Examinees without a photo ID will be subject to the reschedule charge.

### Students with Disabilities:

Students needing special testing accommodations should contact the Testing Center by phone or email before scheduling the test date. Prior approval is required and support documentation may need to be.

### Score Reports and Policies:

Unofficial score reports are available on the day of the test (except for the College Composition and Language with Writing tests). Additional score reports, score report questions and other policy information are available at [www.collegeboard.com/clep](http://www.collegeboard.com/clep). Scores are kept on file by CLEP for 20 years.

### Re-testing:

Examinees must wait three months before re-taking an examination.

### Important Information for Colorado Mesa University Students:

A student may not earn CLEP credit in a class in which they have previously been enrolled including a class from which the student withdrew, so that the transcript shows a W, WP, or WF. Each academic department determines if and under what conditions non-traditional credit is allowed. These non-traditional credits include CLEP, DSST, and Credit by Examination/Challenge Exams. If allowed, the following limits apply (includes credits from each type of non-traditional credit); max of 30 semester credit hours for baccalaureate degree, 20 semester credit hours for Associate of Applied Science degree, 12 semester credit hours for an Associate of Arts or Associates of Science degree, and 6 semester credit hours for a technical certificate.

\*Students with credit for ENGL 111 may take the College Composition exam for ENGL 112 credit only. Scores will be sent 3-4 weeks after the test date.
