

PARTICIPATION

We want you to get the most out of this program, which means participating weekly!

To remain in Upward Bound, students are required to do one of the following:

- 1. Attend after-school <u>once a week</u> (for the entire 90minute session!); or
- 2. Schedule <u>a one-on-one</u> appointment with their UB advisor to discuss their academic & college goals

<u>Failure to meet this requirement will result in you being dismissed from the program!</u>



FIRST QUARTER GRADES

The first quarter ends on October 11th!

If you have <u>any of the following</u>, you will need to meet with Aaron or Maria to develop a tutoring plan ASAP:

- 1. Any class with a grade below a B;
- 2. Any class with missing assignments;
- 3. Any class with multiple absences.

Grades are critical to keeping you on track for your college goals! Start the year off strong by crushing this first quarter!



STIPENDS

\$25 stipends will be paid monthly to students who:

- 1. Participate in UB at least once weekly; and
- 2. Attend the monthly Saturday session; and
- 3. Make substantial progress toward their academic goals.
