SESSION

JULY 7-11

Students moved into Tolman Hall at Colorado Mesa University for a **week-long taste of college life**.

Days began with breakfast in the CMU cafeteria and a morning workshop, followed by afternoon activities exploring campus. Evenings featured interactive events before returning to the dorms for everyone's favorite late-night ramen and rest.



Two to three-hour sessions focused on professional presentation skills, career exploration, developing healthy relationships, and personal goal reflection.



Cooking competitions, arts and crafts, origami, gym sessions, and dance parties kept the fun going and connected students with other first-generation peers from Upward Bound programs across Colorado.





Activities like indoor rock climbing, tie dyeing, and a day spent fishing and hiking on the Grand Mesa, pushed students out of their comfort zones and into creative spaces.



The week ended with **300 first-generation Upward Bound students** competing in the annual Olympics at CMU, joining mixed teams from across Colorado in sand volleyball, basketball, soccer, kickball, and quiz bowl.

ADVENTURE IN **DURANGO:** THE SCHOLARS TRIP

JULY 14-17

The final week of summer was the annual Scholars Trip, where Upward Bound students traveled to southwestern Colorado to celebrate the end of the program and recognize their hard work over the past six weeks.

Full tour of Fort Lewis College led by first-generation college students and staff from the Fort Lewis Admissions Office.

Four days living on campus at Fort Lewis College. Students experienced apartment-style residence halls, eating in the cafeteria, and enjoying the FLC campus.

OUTDOOR EXCURSIONS

A full day was spent learning about Pueblo culture and heritage from our National Park Service guide at the ancient dwellings of Mesa Verde.

Students enjoyed an afternoon rafting the Lower Animas River, featuring white water rapids and plenty of opportunities to get splashed!

Trips to the Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory, Purgatory Ski Area, and Downtown Durango exposed students to new places and experiences that they otherwise would not have had back home in Grand Junction.

Hands-on leadership activities, board games, and an open mic night taught students to ask for help, work as a team, and show gratitude to one another.
