

Bio, Kevin McBride, P.E.

Kevin studied Watershed Science and Hydrology at Colorado State University and Ecological Engineering at the Colorado School of Mines. He received a B.S and M.S., both from CSU, and is a licensed Professional Engineer in Colorado.

He has worked in several water specialties including, mined land reclamation, as the Trapper Mine in Moffatt county was just beginning production and designing water and wastewater infrastructure in Steamboat Springs, as the ski area and related housing was built.

He spent 16 years developing the Stormwater Quality program in Fort Collins as it grew into the fourth largest City in Colorado and experienced one of the worst flash floods in Colorado history.

For the past decade he has served as the general manager of the Upper Yampa Water Conservancy District completing a 3,600 acre-foot expansion of Stagecoach Reservoir and the first lease of reservoir water in Colorado under the "3 in 10" rule with the Colorado Water Trust and CWCB.

Kevin serves on the Yampa-White-Green Basin Roundtable, the Inter Basin Compact Committee, and the Colorado Water Congress and Water Education Colorado Boards.
